

Summer Food Program at the Noble County Helps Combat Child Hunger

Thanks to Walmart Foundation support, the Y's Summer Food Program is available at sites across the country this summer.

[Perry]—According to the U.S. Department of Agriculture, around 22 million kids receive free or reduced-cost meals thanks to the National School Lunch Program. However, once the school year ends, only 17 percent of those same kids are able to access free meals over the summer break, leaving many children without during the summer months.

The Y is working to fill that gap, and thanks to support from the Walmart Foundation, will help keep children healthy and well-nourished this summer, ensuring that kids reach their full potential. Participating youth will receive both food and fun through nutritious meals and snacks, while also enjoying recreational and learning activities aimed at keeping bodies and minds active. Y sites across the country, including The Noble County Family YMCA, will offer the Summer Food Program to any child under 18. The program runs from May 18th to August 16.

Now in its thirteenth year, the Summer Food Program is part of an existing national partnership between YMCA of the USA (Y-USA) and the Walmart Foundation to address child hunger, which is more prevalent during the summertime. Made possible by a grant from the Walmart Foundation, the Y is better able to reach kids in need. The program is part of the Y's year-round effort to address child hunger; during the school year, the Y's Afterschool Meal Program provides a combination of learning activities and healthy meals and/or snacks at the end of the school day.

The YMCA will be offering free meals to youth at three locations this summer with the following schedule:

The Noble County Family YMCA is taking the Summer Food Program into the community to reach youth who may not be able to visit the Y. Kids will have access to healthy meals and snacks and fun activities through the Y's Tim Hight Food Program.

In Perry, The Y served 14,299 meals and snacks during the 2022-2023 School Year. Since the Noble County Family YMCA began its food security work, the Tim Hight Food Program has

served over 70,000 meals and snacks to Noble County youth. The Y's commitment is to help kids achieve their full potential by nurturing their physical, mental and character development. Since the start of the Summer Food Program, the YMCAs across the country have served over 220 million healthy meals and snacks to hundreds of thousands of kids.

During the school year, the Noble County Family YMCA will also serve healthy meals and snacks in its afterschool program to provide kids with nourishment and academic enrichment.
